
Patients' experience 25% of respondents to **EU survey say** they or their family experienced an adverse event with healthcare

Composed of two parts:

General patient safety issues (seven recommendations)

Prevention and control of healthcare associated infections (two recommendations)

General patient safety issues: Action for Member States

- Support the development of national patient safety policies and programmes
- Empower and inform citizens and patients
 - Establish or strengthen reporting and learning systems on adverse events
- Include patient safety in the education and training of health professionals



General patient safety issues: Action for the EU

- Classify, codify and measure patient safety
- Share knowledge, experience and best practice at European level
- Develop and promote research on patient safety



Prevention and control of healthcare associated infections

- Adopt and implement a strategy at the appropriate level for the prevention and control of healthcare associated infections (six objectives)
- Consider setting up an inter-sectoral mechanism for the coordinated implementation of the strategy

Report by the Commission – due in June 2012
Further steps in 2012 if necessary

- Exchange of best practice Joint Action
- Healthcare associated infections ECDC



Implementation Taxonomy and indicators

Ongoing work within the Commission's Patient Safety and Quality of Care Working Group. Account taken of the work of the WHO on the International Classification for Patient Safety and the HealthCare Quality Indicators Project led by the OECD.



Implementation Exchange of best practice

Preparation of a joint action on patient safety and quality of care between the Commission and Member States, under the Health Programme, for 2011-2014. The first preparatory meeting will be held by the Commission in July 2010. Project submission: beginning 2011.



Implementation Healthcare associated infections **Ongoing work by the ECDC on three** sets of indicators: for the hospital level, for the regional/national level, and a set of indicators to measure the implementation as well as the effectiveness of the HCAI recommendations.



From patient safety to wider quality of healthcare

- Discussions in the Council Working Party on Public Health at Senior Level under the French and Spanish Presidencies
- Reflection paper on healthcare quality developed by the Commission and the working group
- Main discussion points:
 - Which areas of quality should and could be addressed at EU level?
 - How to ensure patient empowerment and involvement of health professionals?
