## Patient Safety - priority for EPF

- Patient organisations role in informing & educating patients
- Patient organisations strong advocacy strategies; an important actor to involve in patient safety policies



## Patient organisations' contribution

#### At EU Level:

► EPF - involved in the EC Patient Safety Working Group Contributed to *Council Recommendation on Patient* Safety and the prevention and control of healthcare associated infections

#### At national level:

  - Patient safety campaign Poland
  - Patient guide for safer hospital stay Denmark
  - Guide for patients to hospital stay Finland
  - Advocacy Toolkit for Patients' Organizations by IAPO



## **EPF** – involved in EUNetPas project

- an example of European collaboration: Member State and civil society around a high priority policy area
- ▶ EPF contributed to the elaboration of a A Guide for Education and Training in Patient Safety:
  - foundation level of understanding of patient safety for health professionals, health educators, health managers, support staff, policy makers AND patients, their families and carers
- A key development in EUNetPas project National Patient Safety Platforms in various MS – important step forward, BUT need for <u>further involvement of</u>


